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INSTITUTE OF FINANCE MANAGEMENT

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IR. KANURA AND MR. MADOFFE VISET INDEA:

The Institute's Principal Dr. R. M. Mayura and Mr. H.S. Madoffe the Director of Personnel and Administration visited India between 23rd August, 1993 and 6th September, 1993. They were in Pune for four days and Bombay for the remainder of the period as guests of four management training institutions to learn from the rich Indian experience and draw lessons for IFM in our overall institutional building and change management initiatives.

The trip, which was fully supported and funded by the Common-wealth Fund for Technical Cooperation had four goals. First to learn how India MTI's are managed generally. Second, to examine these institutions incentive schemes and strategies to prevent staff turn over and attract new ones. Third, to find out how computer facilities are managed, maintained and administered to ensure optimal use and avoid malfunctioning. And finally to gain insight on how research and consultancy work is organized.

In Pune, the dual spent quite sometime at the National Institute of Bank Management. In Bombay three institutes were visited, namely the Indian Institute of Bankers, the Narser Management School and the Jamnalal Bajaj Institute of Management Studies.

In all these institutions the delegation was met by the Chief Executives, given a tour of the campuses, inspected facilities especially computer labs and Libraries, had audience with senior academic and administrative staff.

The lessons drawn from this visit are many and quite valuable. The Principal and the Director of Administration are reflecting on the lessons learnt to see what can be effectively applied in the specific environment of IFM in particular and Tanzania in general.

So, watch out for the few wonderful surprises in the not too distance future.

WATER PROBLEM ALLEVIATED

In Its continuous efforts to make life of members of the IFM community comfortable, the Institute has taken several steps to alleviate the water problem at its campus.

Measures undertaken include:

- . An additional and bigger water pipe to the New Hostel.
- . An underground water tank has been built with an additional inlet pipe and a water pump in the "New Wing".

Besides these measures, studies are underway toward solving water problem in the Main Building. For some time the Management has been buying water using bowzers.

It has been noted with regret that some unknown people for reasons only consistent with sabotage have been shutting the main cokes of the water supply system to the main building and the new hostel block. The Newsletter urges the entire IFM community to be vigilant to expose these elements and to prevent sabotage.

Preparation for this ceremony due to be held towards the end of October has started under the Chairmanship of the Director of Administration Mr. H. S. Madoffe.

IFM STAFF GETS NEW UNIFORM

All the staff entitled to uniform have been availed at least one pair. Another pair will be availed depending on the revenue situation of the Institute and especially subsidy from Government.

Director of Administration has issued a circular urging all with uniforms to ensure that they put them on at all times whilst working for the Institute or face disciplinary action. Heads of Department have been told to supervise adheherence.

DEPOSITORY OF DOCUMENTS AT IFM LIBRARY

The Institute of Finance Management was established as a teaching and learning organisation which also conducts research and provides consultancy services.

In discharging the above responsibilities IFM depends heavily on the use of recorded information in various forms, e.g. books, films and video-taps.

The success and quality of IFM output will very much depend on availability and use of recorded information, as well as the ability and willingness of its members of staff to generate more knowledge and indeed, publish.

Considering the role of incentives in society, academicians publish to contribute to knowledge, raise their status i.e. academic standing and earn their living,

Recognising the above IFM has issued various circulars to encourage and motivate its staff to publish. These include a progressive scheme of service, awards to those who write papers, or publish; and lucrative remuneration for running courses, or conducting research and consultancy.

The library as an information resources centre for IFM and an ever growing organism, has seriously taken the above issues into consideration in its development strategies to organise publications and offer information services. To meet the present and future IFM information needs for teaching Study, research, consultancy and for prosperity, a new section has been established to be known as GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS. This section will house Government documents, World Bank Publications and documents produced by the IFM Community as well as documents on or about IFM by any other person or institution. Materials stored in the library are those produced for circulation.

It is the responsibility of any faculty member or employee of the Institute of Finance Management who produce or causes to produce recorded Information in any form, to deposit at least one copy with the Department of library and Information service.

The Department of library service will ensure that such a copy or copies are in safe custody in the library. The library will issue regularly a list of materials so deposited for circulation to publicise the intellectual output of IFM to a much wider audience.

COMMERCIALIZATION OF CAFETARIA SERVICES

A report on the study of commercilization of cafetaria services has been presented to the management. The study was conducted under the Chairmanship of Prof. Arora.

Terms of reference included:

- The ever rising cost of food stuff, utilities etc.
- The expected demand by students to be given meal allowance lieu of meals.

- The government policy on "cost sharing".
- The welfare of about 44 cafetaria employees.
- The current physical facilities related to the cafeteria.
- Practices and experiences of similar institutions such as UDSM, IDM Mzumbe and Ardhi Institute.
- "Management time" of running the caferetia .

The management intends to study it very carefully get the inputs of all the relevant parties especially OTTU tabling it to the Governing Council for reaction and decision.

The workshop covered the following topics:-

- . Designing and performing a research project.
- . Nature and role of research.
- . What is data.
- . Survey methods.
- . Research design.
- . Writing the research report.
- . Content and organising of the manuscript.

About eighteen IFM staff members benefitted from this course.

During this visit Dr. White participated in the IFM Staff Development Seminars at which he presented a paper on "Aid Dependence in Tanzania".

In this paper Dr. White emphasized that the objective of Aid was to supplement domestic savings and export earnings so that eventually a country became self sustaining. He also pointed out that in order for the Aid to be beneficial to a given country and bring about self sustenance there was a need for certain pre-conditions to exist within that country. These Preconditions if not met, would lead to that country being Aid Dependent.

MR. SHIRIMA REPORTS BACK TO IFM

Mr. Liberatus L. Shirima, Senior Lecturer in Finance and Management reported back to the Institute after a two year leave of absence. He was a Financial Consultant to a World Bank financed project on local Government finances under the Office of the Prime Minister and First Vice President. In summary Mr. L.L. Investment Targets Programme which covered identification of investment opportunities, assessment of capital cost of those projects the design of a cost recovery programme i.e. determination of user charges required to meet the recurrent costs of the recommended projects deemed essential to improve urban services delivery.

While away with the Prime Minister and First Vice President's Office/World Bank Mr. L.L. Shirima was able to fulfill the membership conditions for the U.K. Institute of Professional Finance Managers and was consequently elected fellow of the Institute.

ADAM AT "COOPERATIVE COMPETITIVENESS SYMPOSIUM"

Adam Mwændenga, a Lecturer of the Institute recently represented the Institute at a Symposium on "Cooperative Competitiveness" held at Cooperative College Moshi. He presented a paper entitled "An Analysis of the present economic environment in Tanzania: Hints on Conditions for Cooperative Competitiveness".
