## MRAMBA VISITS IFM

## Mramba's visit

- State of the art multimedia distance learning facility viz Tanzania Global Distance Learning Centre (TGDLIC)
- Acquired over 200 computers for training and research
- Conducted more than 40 consultancy assignments for the Government, Banking sector and Social Security Institutions
- Conducted 500 short courses to about 8000 beneficiaries
- Marketable graduates
- Collaborations with external Universities like that of Strathclyde in the U.K. and The Indian Institute of Foreign trade (IIFT)

Mr. Madoffe underscored the importance of speeding the process of changing the status of the Institute to a full-fledged University. He also requested the Government to resume student sponsorship.

## Minister's Response

Hon. Mramba on his part said that he decided to visit the Institute so as to learn and have a clearer picture of the activities of the Institute and see which areas his Ministry can assist.

He urged the Management and other stakeholders to adhere to the initial objectives of the Institute when it was established in 1972.

Giving counsel to the students, he urged them to work very hard as this world was becoming very competitive.

Moreover he pledged to look into the possibility of resuming Government Fellowships to IFM.

## PUBLISHING

Dr. Patrick Mugoya published an article titled, 'Exchange Rate Movements, Monetary Policy and the Macroeconomy of Tanzania, 1993-99. in the 'Tanzania Economic Trends, Journal Vol. 9 No.1.of December 1997'.

Dr. Mugoyas's article assesses the effectiveness of individual instruments by which the Bank of Tanzania (BOT) conducts its monetary policy.

The article concludes that caution must be taken by policy makers when considering economic policy advice based on text - book theories.

Mr. Isaya Jairo, Lecturer in the Accounting Department, published one article in "The Accountant" Vol. 13 No. 2 of April - June 2001. The National Board of Accountants and Auditors publishes this Journal.

The article was titled, "Reducing Third Party Audit Litigation: Current Trend and the Role of Accountancy Profession."

This article traces the development of auditor's legal liability to third parties since the case of London and General Bank (1895) to present.

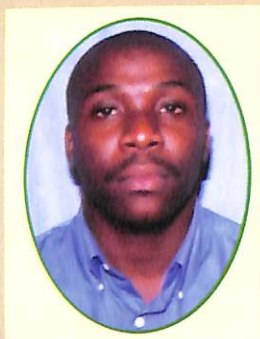
